

SUBJECT: Military Postal Service Agency's (MPSA) 2014 Strategic Postal Voting
Action Plan

The enclosed action plan postures the Military Postal Service (MPS) to support the 2014 General election in compliance with the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA), the Military Overseas Voter Empowerment (MOVE) Act, and DoD directives. As an extension of the United States Postal Service (USPS), the MPS provides expedited processing, shipment, and tracking of absentee ballots from overseas Military Post Offices to the state election offices. This plan also lists requirements for the Military Services to include implementing guidance on processing balloting material in accordance with MPSA's 2014 Strategic Postal Voting Action Plan.

MPSA Vision

***Provide best value postal services to authorized DoD patrons, in peace and war...
Around the clock, around the world.***

The Military Postal Service Agency (MPSA) is an extension of the United States Postal Service (USPS) and the single Department of Defense (DoD) agency responsible for military mail. MPSA functionally manages the efficient and responsive processing, transportation, and distribution of Official and Personal Mail throughout DoD by providing responsive, technical support and guidance on policy and efficient procedures through direct liaison with the Services and other government agencies (OGA).

MPSA Voting Goal

Provide expedited processing, transportation, distribution, and tracking of absentee ballots while maintaining the integrity and security of ballot movement through the Military Postal Service (MPS). The MPS will be an effective service provider focused on efficiency and responsiveness.

The MPSA 2014 Strategic Postal Voting Action Plan reflects the Military and Overseas Voter Empowerment (MOVE) Act legislation to provide accountability, safeguarding, and expeditious delivery of balloting materials to and from Military Post Offices (MPO). All U.S. citizens, with or without MPO privileges, are authorized to mail balloting material from any MPO.

MPS Support for Voting Strategic Vision

Enhancing MPSA's efforts with USPS and the Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) in support of the UOCAVA and MOVE Act.

Our strategy is to continuously enhance mail handling processes to fully support our patrons' right to vote. The right to vote is one of our most important rights as U.S. Citizens. The customers we serve are making sacrifices to preserve this right; processing of absentee ballots must be given special attention. Through the continuing diligence of our military and civilian postal workforce, communication and collaboration with USPS, and FVAP, we will ensure compliance with regulatory guidelines and continue to move towards a more effective mail system in support of the 2014 elections.

MPS Support for Voting Strategic Objectives

Establishes the framework for compliance with the voting law and initiatives for the 2014 election year.

The plan establishes eight objectives for the DoD MPS support to absentee voting.

Military Postal Service Agency 2014 Strategic Postal Voting Action Plan

Objective 1: Ensure the MPS adheres to current voting laws and directives

Discussion: The MPSA will disseminate policy, guidance, and clarification to ensure military postal activities comply with the references. Military postal activities will establish and disseminate written local procedures for processing balloting material in accordance with MPSA's 2014 Strategic Voting Action Plan and the references. MPSA, and the military postal activities will assess compliance and various reporting mechanisms in the Automated Military Postal System (AMPS) while conducting aggressive quality assurance/control measures daily.

MPOs will process voted absentee ballots for General elections IAW the references. Absentee ballots for Special and Primary elections will not receive an Express Mail Label 11-DoD per reference 2. Express Mail Service (EMS) Label 11-DoD shall be applied to voted ballots accepted at overseas MPOs for the 2014 General election only. EMS Label 11-DoD shall be applied to all envelopes addressed to an election office in the United States, and mailed by Uniformed Services personnel, voting age dependents and civilians stationed overseas with MPO privileges. All other U.S. citizens abroad will not have a Label 11-DoD applied to their ballot, but will be processed in accordance to reference 5.

Overseas Military Postal Activities will be notified via Defense Message Service (DMS) from MPSA with dates for authorized usage of EMS Label 11-DoD. Use of EMS Label 11-DoD prior to notification from MPSA will result in postage costs to be billed to the appropriate Service.

In accordance with reference 2, the deadline for ballots to be collected and postmarked at overseas military postal activities is noon (local time) on the seventh day preceding the date of the regular scheduled general election for federal office. Overseas Military Postal Activities with intermittent transportation networks or other limiting factors may establish alternative mailing deadlines to ensure absentee ballots reach election offices by the election date (see appendix C).

Standards:

- MPSA
 - Publish MPSA's 2014 Strategic Postal Voting Action Plan NLT **January 5, 2014**
 - Host teleconferences and/or other audio visual conferences with Service Representatives, JMPA and Postal Voting Representatives to address questions and concerns
 - Revise postal voting training in AMPS
 - Launch After Action Review Survey in AMPS NLT **November 30, 2014**
- Service Representatives
 - Ensure recommended absentee ballot mailing dates for the 2014 General election are included in the Service Postal Voting Action Plans (Objective 2) for each overseas MPO. Suspense is **February 10, 2014**

- Ensure alternative deadlines are established for afloat Navy ships, remote forward operating bases, and locations with limited transportation networks to ensure absentee ballots reach election offices by the election date
- Encourage MPO and MACOM PVRs to complete After Action Review Survey in AMPS, **December 1 – 14, 2014**

Objective 2: Synchronize action plans of the Military Services

Discussion: Military Services will develop and publish a Service Postal Voting Action Plan that supports MPESA's Strategic Postal Voting Action Plan. Services shall address their approach to meeting the eight objectives listed in MPESA's plan.

Standards:

- Service Representatives
 - Develop and publish a Service Postal Voting Action Plan to support MPESA's Strategic Postal Action Plan NLT **February 10, 2014**
 - Ensure Service Postal Voting Action Plan includes implementation and procedural guidance unique to missions and overseas locations. Examples of this are ship to shore movement of absentee ballots, distribution and collection of absentee ballots to and from remote locations with limited logistical support, and adverse weather conditions
 - List mailing deadlines for collection and dispatch of absentee ballots from overseas MPOs
 - Ensure MPOs appoint a minimum of two Postal Voting Representatives (PVR) at each postal activity and establish deadlines to complete postal voting training. PVRs must be appointed and completed required training in the AMPS NLT **February 28, 2014**
 - Ensure MPOs inventory the following supplies and equipment in AMPS NLT **February 28, 2014**: Express Mail Label 11-DoD, cancelling devices, scanning equipment, Tag 191, Express Mail bags. Subsequent inventories shall be conducted on a **weekly basis at a minimum**
 - Ensure MPOs enter ballot count data in AMPS for prograde and retrograde balloting material, **September 1, 2014 - November 30, 2014**

Objective 3: Reduce undeliverable as addressed absentee (UAA) ballots at overseas Military Post Offices (MPO)

Discussion: The Military Postal Automated Redirection System (PARS) modifications were approved and funded during 1st quarter of FY2014. Modifications are scheduled to be completed by **August 2014**, and prior to local election officials shipping absentee ballots to voters overseas. PARS will prevent letter mail (to include absentee ballots) and publications from transiting to overseas MPO for redirect service. Instead, mail with USPS compliant addressing will be redirected at the first U.S. mail processing facility, to the customer's new change of address (COA) record on file with USPS. PARS reduces

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transit of redirect mail by up to 31 days depending on unit and ship deployments overseas.

Note: UAA absentee ballots with non-compliant addressing format will still filter through to overseas post offices. Postal clerks shall provide redirect service to current COA on file IAW reference 6.

Standards:

- MPSA:
 - Continue coordinating with USPS to track modifications of PARS for automated redirection of letter mail (to include absentee ballots) and publications to overseas military addresses that are USPS compliant
- Service Representatives:
 - Continue to standardize military addresses IAW USPS Pub 28, Postal Addressing Standards
 - Utilize all available means to redirect UAA absentee ballots

Objective 4: Improve tracking visibility of voted ballots from acceptance to delivery to local election officials

Discussion: USPS Engineers approved modifications to the scanning system to allow piece-to-bag nesting of mail pieces (to include absentee ballots) and tracking via Global Business System (GBS) for subsequent scan tracking. Testing is scheduled to start **March 2014**. Estimated completion is **August 2014**.

Nesting would provide the necessary visibility to determine the location of ballots within the transportation network overseas, to the point it is turned over to USPS in the U.S. Past capabilities failed to identify the location of ballots between overseas dispatches to air carriers to the time it reaches the USPS International Service Center (ISC) within the U.S.

Standards:

- MPSA:
 - Continue coordinating with USPS during the modification and testing phase of the Global Business System (GBS) to provide nesting capability that associates absentee ballots to a shipping container
- Service Representatives:
 - Ensure procedures are in place for all postal activities to conduct the required scans to capture tracking data from acceptance to delivery

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Objective 5: Initiate postal voting communication plans

Discussion: Communication is the key to a successful election season. MPSA will initiate an aggressive media campaign to educate overseas MPO patrons on the importance of mailing their absentee ballots in a timely manner. Synchronizing voting campaign efforts with (FVAP) and Service Voting Assistance Officers (SVAO) will prevent duplicated efforts. MPO communication to our patrons regarding the projected transit times from austere locations and ships afloat to CONUS will ensure absentee ballots reach election offices in sufficient time.

Standards:

- MPSA:
 - Conduct telephone conferences with Joint Military Postal Activity (JMPA), Service Component Commands, MPOs, and Mail Address Only (MAO), throughout the 2014 voting season.
 - Publish media releases, defense messages, articles, and voting awareness posters
 - Utilize DoD Public Affairs Office (PAO) and the Armed Forces Radio and Television Services to promote MPOs absentee ballot mailing deadlines for overseas voters
 - Post voting information, updates, and reminders on AMPS home page
- Service Representatives:
 - Develop partnerships with SVAO to communicate postal requirements in support of their command voting programs
 - Ensure broad use of media during:
 - Armed Forces Voters Week and Overseas Citizens Voters Week, **June 30 - July 7, 2014**
 - Absentee Voting Week, **September 29 – October 6, 2014**
 - Recommended Mailing Dates by location
 - Incorporate procedures for collecting absentee ballots for U.S. citizens abroad that are not authorized MPO use or access to military installations

Objective 6: Provide postal voting training to all postal personnel

Discussion: The revised online postal voting training module will activate in AMPS NLT **December 31, 2013**. Military postal activities will designate and assign a minimum of (2) or more PVRs for the processing of ballots within each of their MPO/MAO locations. PVRs must certify / recertify on voting within AMPS. Military postal activities will include guidance and listings of MPO/MAO responsibilities within their Service Postal Voting Action Plan. Military postal activities should consider long-term status when designating PVRs to ensure a subject matter expert is present throughout the voting year. Military postal activities will update PVRs in AMPS when changes occur.

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Standards:

- MPSA:
 - Publish revised postal voting training and certification in AMPS NLT **December 31, 2013**
 - Launch refresher training videos in AMPS NLT **March 2014**
- Service Representatives:
 - Ensure each MPO/MAO location designate and assign two (2) or more PVRs
 - Enforce 100% completion of voting training in AMPS for designated PVRs NLT **January 31, 2014**
 - Review reporting sites in AMPS and ensure training is in compliance with MPSA's reporting requirements
 - Incorporate and validate training for processing and handling absentee ballots and voting materials provided to unit mail clerk and mail orderlies as part of Service Voting Action Plan

Objective 7: Ensure distribution of voting supplies, materials, cancelling devices, and scanning equipment

Discussion: In accordance with reference 2 and 5, all voted absentee ballots must be legibly postmarked and processed in a timely manner. In order to achieve this requirement, all MPOs/MAOs must validate serviceable cancelling devices are on hand, or request a new one. MPO/postal activities are required to inventory and enter in AMPS all on-hand voting supplies and equipment to include DoD Express Mail Label 11, Express Mail Bags, TAG 191 and scanning equipment (i.e. scanner or POS). Local Supply personnel are to submit voting supply and equipment requests to JMPA for fulfillment. MPO/Postal Activities shall treat DoD Express Mail Label 11-DoD as a controlled item. The premature use or misuse of each DoD express Mail Label 11 inherits a cost the Service will pay. Only use DoD Express Mail Label 11 during the General elections and place them on absentee ballots of Uniformed Services personnel, voting age dependents and civilians stationed overseas with MPO privileges (Appendix A). All other U.S. citizens abroad may ship their absentee ballot from overseas MPOs in accordance with reference 6 however; a Label 11-DoD will not be affixed.

Postal Activities will contact Installation Voting Action Officers to ensure the following voting supplies are available to customers in MPO lobbies: Federal Write-In Absentee Ballots (FWAB), Federal Post Card Application (FPCA), and Voting Guides.

Standards:

- MPSA:
 - Activate the AMPS voting supply inventory module NLT **December 31, 2013**

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- JMPAs:
 - Distribute voting materials and DoD Express Mail Label 11-DoD to all postal activities
 - Maintain accountability of Express Mail Label 11-DoD and push of absentee ballot materials
 - Publish distribution plan to MPSA and military postal activities
 - Provide update on volumes of ballot material arriving at USPS Gateways
 - Provide required data on prograde ballots arriving at USPS Gateways after the 45 days mailing deadline

- Service Representatives:
 - Ensure postal activities conduct 100% inventory status on voting material and equipment in AMPS NLT **January 31, 2014**
 - Ensure postal activities have serviceable cancelling devices on-hand
 - Coordinate with Installation Voting Assistance Officer for additional voting guides, FPCAs and FWAB's
 - Monitor voting supplies on-hand in AMPS to ensure locations have ample quantities to last through end of election period

Objective 8: Encourage inspection of postal activities by Inspector Generals (IG) to determine the readiness level to provide postal support for the election

Discussion: Services' IG is required to conduct annual inspections of their Voting Assistance Programs. IGs may inspect postal activities as part of their annual inspection to ensure compliance with the listed references. Military postal activities must ensure procedures are in place to support all local IG inspections. Service Representatives must ensure all Component Commands postal activities are conducting and documenting inspections IAW reference 6. Postal inspections must include assessment of procedures for handling balloting materials, inventory, directory service and scanning requirements and accountability of Express Mail Label 11-DoD. An integral part of maintaining compliance with applicable voting laws and procedures is reliance on Component Commands and Inspectors General to familiarize themselves with MPS voting standards.

Standards:

- MPSA:
 - Liaison with DoD Inspector General
 - Support DoD IG voting inspections

- Service Representatives:
 - Request Service IG support to ensure each MPO/postal activity are compliant to regulatory guidance for proper handling of absentee ballot materials within the MPS and unit mail clerks and orderlies procedures to customer
 - Ensure Service IG is aware of requirement to audit, inspect and provide assistance to MPS under their jurisdiction per DoD 4525.6-M, C1.1.6.3.3

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- Ensure deficiencies are documented and corrected prior to subsequent inspections
- Military Services' Postal Voting Action Plan will include an internal voting inspection requirement and frequency to ensure adequate supplies are on hand and the proper procedures for handling absentee ballots enforced

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References

1. 39 USC 3406(b) – Balloting materials under the UOCAVA.

a) Balloting materials under the UOCAVA (individually or in bulk)

(1) shall be carried expeditiously and free of postage; and

(2) may be mailed at a post office established outside the United States under section 406 of this title, unless such mailing is prohibited by treaty or other international agreement of the United States

b) As used in this section, the term balloting materials has the meaning given that term in section 107 of the UOCAVA.

2. Public Law 111-84 – The MOVE Act is Subtitle H of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year 2010. The overall purpose is to help military serving overseas and citizens who live abroad vote in U.S. elections. Section 580 provides procedures for collecting and delivery of marked absentee ballots of absent overseas uniformed Services voters.

3. Public Law 99-410 - UOCAVA citizens are U.S. citizens who are active members of the Uniformed Services, the Merchant Marine, the Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Services, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, their family members, and U.S. citizens residing outside the United States. This Act provides the legal basis for absentee voting requirements for these citizens. It was amended in 2002 by the Help America Vote Act, the NDAA for Fiscal Year 2002, and the Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2005.

4. Public Law 107-107 – The NDAA for Fiscal Year 2002, title XVI Uniformed Services Voting amends the UOCAVA reinforcing and clarifying requirements of the UOCAVA regarding the importance of voting, Voting Assistance Programs, guarantee of residency for military personnel, simplification of voter registration, and absentee ballot application procedures for absent uniformed and overseas voters and rules regarding the use of DoD facilities as polling places.

5. DoD Directive 1000.04 – The FVAP provides direction to DoD components and other Federal agencies under the UOCAVA.

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


6. DoD 4525.6M – DoD Postal Manual, subparagraphs C3.1.3.5, C3.2.3.5, C3.4.6.9, C3.5, and paragraph C10.4.9 provides guidance regarding the processing of balloting materials. Absentee balloting material shall be afforded the most expeditious handling and transmission possible and processed as personally addressed official mail. Ballots and others voting material, in card or letter form shall be postmarked. Absentee ballots must be legibly postmarked and be processed in a timely manner. Any U.S. citizen with or without MPO privileges can mail balloting material from any MPO, U.S. Embassy or Consulate per 39 U.S.C. 3406(reference (b)).
